American Automakers Applaud Passage of Legislation Enhancing US Semiconductor Production

Washington, D.C. – American Automakers Ford Motor Company, General Motors and Stellantis praised passage of the United States Innovation and Competition Act, which will enhance U.S. production of semiconductors and improve domestic supply chain resiliency.

AAPC and our American Automaker member companies have been working with the Biden administration, Congress, the United Auto Workers and our supplier partners at the Motor and Equipment Manufacturers Association to address semiconductor shortages, and while there is much more work ahead, passage of this critical legislation in the Senate is a big step forward."
