



AAPC Statement on Governor Blunt's Testimony on the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership

WASHINGTON, D.C. – American Automotive Policy Council (AAPC) President Matt Blunt today issued a statement on the testimony he provided on the Economic Opportunities for U.S. Automakers Created by the Proposed Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership Agreement.

“A strong Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP) pact between the United States and our European Union friends will expand trade, boosting jobs and economic growth on both sides of the Atlantic.

“The TTIP holds incredible economic potential and will represent the largest share of auto production and sales ever covered by a single free trade agreement.

“The breakdown of tariffs and regulatory barriers will boost growth for Chrysler, Ford and GM, as well as for their counterparts in Europe. It is key that negotiators work towards an ambitious outcome and do their utmost to unify and simplify automotive regulations.”
